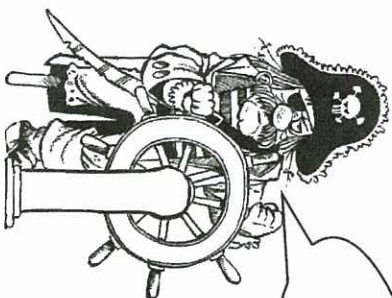

Cub Scout Leader Training

34. **Youth Protection-** Do your part to ensure the safety of the youth in our program. This is required training for all leaders who work with Scouts. **This course will take two sessions, only choose 5 additional classes.**
35. **Cub Scout Leader Specific Training-** This course will meet the council training standards if you a registered leader in your pack. This course will take a half day; only select four additional classes.
36. **BALOO-**One leader from your pack must have this training if your pack is participating in overnight activities. This will provide you with basic outdoor knowledge and will help you plan a safe, fun, outdoor program. This course will take all day; do not schedule additional courses.
