



## **Camp Sequassen Dining Hall; Adornments, Memorabilia, etc.**

**General Guidelines:** The appearance of the Dining Hall is perceived as being representative of our camp. The intention of this policy is to insure a level of appropriateness and good taste in keeping with the traditions of the camp, the council and the Boy Scouts of America.

### **General Guidelines:**

#### Objects:

- must be in good condition, suitable for the Dining Hall and easy to keep clean.
- must not pose a fire hazard.
- must not pose health risks, i.e. be composed of materials such as cloth, fur, hair, etc.
- may not in any way obstruct operations in dining hall.
- with non current council name are prohibited w/ exception of objects from International events held at camp.
- /patch representations size limits; 36" round, 30" square, and pocket flap 20" height by 48" length. Other shapes to be sized relative to ones listed but not larger (existing objects not meeting guidelines due to size restrictions will be grandfathered in).
- from the unit or district levels will not be accepted.
- hung will be considered as gifts to the council and therefore the property of the council including any disposition thereof.
- meeting all criteria can generally remain on walls for a period of up to five years and in special cases longer at the discretion of the Council Camping Committee.

### **Standard Allowances:**

- Objects pertaining to Dining Hall operations.
- Objects relative to "Camp Sequassen" History and Traditions.
- The mural by Joseph C. Schork and the interpretation by the author.
- International events held at camp; i.e. patch representations and guest country flag mockups.
- An appropriate balance of objects depicting the Boy Scout programs.
- Resident camp program objects/fixtures; i.e. bulletin board/s, annual award program plaques etc.

### **Special Allowances and Maximums:**

- Powder Horn - 1 object.
- Woodbadge - 1 object.
- National events attended by council contingent/s - 1 object.
- Sequassen Alumni Association - 1 object.
- Order of the Arrow - 2 objects; current lodge pocket flap patch representation, most current conclave held at Sequassen.
- Council events held at camp - 3 objects.
- Other objects that fit the general guidelines but fall outside of the above Special Allowances may be presented to the Council Camping Committee for consideration.

### **Authority:**

- The Council Camping Committee has final authority in all relative matters including which objects may be displayed and how, with consideration to advice from the Camp Ranger, the Camp Director and the Director of Program.
- The Camp Ranger has temporary authority pending decision of the Council Camping Committee.
