Registration

All registrations will be done online. The link to the online registration is on the district website. The online registration link will close on October 4th at 11:59pm.

Units must register all of the members of their unit that wish to participate, and provide a count of how many patrols they are entering. Individuals may not register separately.

Registration Prices:

The Registration rate is \$20.00 for youth, \$7.00 for adults

Late registrations are not guaranteed and can be made by emailing Matt Banas at banas89@gmail.com. A confirmation email will be sent if the registration is accepted.

Only registered scouts are allowed to attend & units must have properly trained leaders in attendance. Registration numbers determine supplies needed for the weekend, we appreciate the early registrations.

This fee covers the camping fee, event supplies and participation patch.

Check In

Arrival will begin at 5:30 pm at Eisenhower Pavilion. The units will be directed to their campsite. While the unit is setting up camp, a unit leader should check in everyone from your troop. Please come prepared with an updated patrol roster for each registered patrol with names of all of the participants from your unit & payment for anyone that did not pay online.

Checks being submitted for payment must be made out to CYC.

Maps & event rotations will be handed out at the leaders meeting. Units should have Health forms on-site. All units must be checked in by 8:00 pm & ready at the Training Cabin by 8:30pm for the leaders meeting.

<u>Parking</u>

All vehicles need to be parked in their assigned lot.

Rotation Activity Stations:

1. Containment Unit

This will be a pioneering station. Patrols will be scored on this event on lashing skill and completion time of the activity. Points will be awarded based on overall time and strength of lashings.

2. Filling Up the Containment Unit

Filling up the containment unit will be a scavenger hunt hike around Hoyt Scout Reservation. Patrols will need to locate various items based of riddles and landmarks in camp. Points will be awarded based on time of completion.

3. No Talking in the Library

Patrols will be completing a team skill activity. Points will be awarded based on completion time.

4. Cleaning Up the Town

Will be a session at the Rifle Range. Patrols will be scored on 10 round groupings. *Scouts must attend the safety briefing in order to shoot on the range.

5. Working at the Firehouse

This will be a pumpkin carving / other theme craft station. Patrols will be judged on creativity and connection to the theme of the weekend. Pumpkins will be displayed at the closing campfire

6. Dealing with the EPA

Patrols will be competing in a team building game. Points will be awarded based on completion time and teamwork

7. Cooking for Zuul

Scouts will complete in a cooking competition. Patrols will need to build a fire and cook for Zuul. Patrols will be awarded points based on completion time, overall presentation of the meal and fire building skill

Weekend Long Competition:

1. Scoutmaster Cook-off

There will be a scoutmaster cook off for any participating scoutmaster that is interested. Points can be earned towards your patrol's score if you indicate what Patrol/s you are representing from your unit. Or you can compete for your own glory.

2. Gateway Competition

Units are encouraged to build theme gateways for their site. This is another opportunity to earn points for your participating patrols. Points will be awarded for creativity, connection to the theme, and scout skill used in construction.

3. Patrol Spirit

Patrol spirit will be judged throughout the weekend. Points can be earned for having a patrol flag, teamwork, scout spirit, and living be the scout oath and law.
