

Want to also congratulate and thank all of our FOS unit presenters team at this time.



SUMMARY

On Feb. 25, 2017, Austin Fruge, a 14-year-old senior patrol leader from Lake Charles, Louisiana, was with his troop traveling westbound on Interstate 10 to Garner State Park in Uvalde County, Texas. Just east of Columbus, Texas, their two vehicles pulled over onto the shoulder of I-10 to allow troop members a restroom break near a tree.

Instead, the Scouts chose to walk to a more secluded area on the other side of a two-way access road, which was actually an old highway with a fast speed limit. On his way back across the access road, Austin was struck by an eastbound pickup truck towing a trailer. He was life-flighted to Houston but tragically passed away three days later.

LESSONS LEARNED

- The unit should have planned for rest stops and breaks. Planning for rest stops should not include the side of the road or trespassing onto private property.
- When deciding to pull over, the unit could have exited the highway to stop on the shoulder of the access road, where there were no streets the youth could have crossed. Or, they could have stopped at one of the many gas stations and convenience stores along I-10.
- Adult leaders did not clearly communicate to the youth the risk of crossing the access road. It also appears that the leaders did not realize or consider that the access road was two-way, and they may not have known its high posted speed limit.
- This tragedy could have been prevented with proper planning and taking a Safety PAUSE (pause/assess/understand/share/execute) to assess possible hazards.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Before your next trip, share Austin's story. Talk with your leaders and youth about what you can do to prevent a similar tragedy.
- · Make safety and rest stops part of your transportation plans.
- Remember that stopping a vehicle on a highway is dangerous and should not happen for any reason other than an emergency.

Powahay SPL Run Camporees

"Empowering youth to be leaders is the core of Scouting. Scouts learn by doing, and what they do is lead their patrols and their troop. They develop a troop program, then take responsibility for figuring out how they will achieve the goals. One of our most important challenges is to train youth leaders to run the troop by providing direction, coaching and support. They will make mistakes now and then and will rely upon the adult leaders to guide them. But only through real hands-on experience as leaders can youth learn to lead." — Scoutmaster Handbook.

This is the concept we are bringing to the Scouts BSA Camporee/Klondike's. Senior Patrol Leaders and other SPL's and youth leaders from troops participating in the event form the Greenbar (PLC) for the camporee. The host SPL serves as the Camporee SPL. SPL's from each troop are invited to a Roundtable for a planning session before the event.

Q: Why host a District Activity?

- It provides unique leadership opportunities and challenges for your youth leaders.
- It gives a chance to show off your troop.
- It provides service and leadership to others.
- It can be fun!

The Team Effort — Host Troop and District Activity Committee

Troop Responsibilities — Manages the Program

- Provides Youth and Adult Leadership to run the program. Program includes (and these can be delegated to other troops):
 - Stations and event activities
 - Scout Own Service
 - Campfire
 - Cracker-barrel for SPL's
- Senior Patrol Leader or Troop Youth Assigned Leader becomes SPL of the Camporee Greenbar.
- 2. Conducts opening and closing ceremonies.
- 3. Provides communications between HQ and units.
- 4. Time keeping and managing the schedule.
- 5. Leads the Campsite Inspections with other SPL's.
- 6. Comes up with program themes and stations or enhance a district suggested theme. Program themes must be approved by the District Activity Committee.
- 7. Can either run all of the stations with unit personnel or the preferred method by sharing with other troops.
- 8. Works with the District Activity Chairman in developing a Leaders Guide.
- 9. The Host Troop can design a patch for the event and then submit to the District Activity Chair for approval and ordering. We need 60 days to order patches. Troops do not order patches.

District Activity Committee Responsibilities

- Provides the logistics
- 1. Provides coaching and works alongside the troop. We can come to your troop meeting.
- 2. Takes care of all of the logistics:
 - We set the fess and manage registrations
 - Promoting the event and printing
 - Arranges camp or locations and all permits
 - Order patches and other large expense items
 - Health and Safety First Aid
 - Parking and traffic
 - Handles check-in and check-out of units.
- 3. Provides additional support staff as needed.
- 4. Set the fees and manages the budget.
 - District Activity Committee will be responsible for ordering patches, pins and other large expense items.
- Works with the host unit in developing a Leaders Guide.

Guidelines:

- All expenses must be approved by the District Activity Chair to ensure that we follow the budget.
- Activities must follow the Guide to Safe Scouting

Powahay's Code of Conduct

Powahay District has established the following Code of Conduct to provide Scouts, Parents, and Adult Leaders with a framework of expectations and disciplinary actions at our district activities. This Code of Conduct will help ensure a common language and understanding for behavioral expectations, and consequences, allowing us to create an atmosphere conducive to fun, safety, and the values of Scouting.

Powahay District has a no tolerance policy for the following:

- Disrupting behavior
- Not following directions
- Being disrespectful to our Adult Staff, Leaders, and other Scouts

Youth members can be dismissed from the event for any of those violations.

District Staff should always be given respect. Directions given by Staff must be obeyed for the good of all Scouts. Failure to do so may result in dismissal from that Scouting event. We want all boys and girls to be able to participate in activities, but we also want them to learn that there are consequences for bad behavior.

Scouts are expected to respect each other. Any behavior that injures, demeans, or offends others is not acceptable and will not be tolerated.

Adult Leaders/Parents

- Act as a role model, demonstrating proper behaviors, language, etc.
- Unit Leaders and parents are responsibility for the safety, wellbeing, and behavior of their charges at all times.
- Work with our staff in correcting behavior issues.
- Be proactive in removing Scouts being disruptive to the program. Bad behavior of a few can escalate quickly to others. Time-out areas can be established giving Scouts an opportunity to adjust their behavior.
- Follow BSA rules regarding discipline and other matters

Let's break out of the 'recruiting season' and welcome new Cub Scouts this winter



What's even more fun than being part of a Cub Scout den? Having at least five kids your age in your den! Whether it's a den for boys or a den for girls, everyone has a better experience if there are more Cub Scouts to share the fun. That's why, even though the traditional fall recruiting season is coming to an end, it's crucial to continue working on recruiting boys and girls into your pack. It's important for each pack to work on filling every den."

New Member Coordinators can spread the word about Scouting and help recruit. Once these families join your pack, the job isn't over, though. Your pack's New Member Coordinator or a similarly dedicated Scout leader can make these new Cub Scouts feel welcome and not left behind. Some tips:

- Recruit with a message of service. Invite neighborhood families to be part of specific kindnesses the pack is providing to the community.
- Encourage pack parents to use social media and post photos and videos of all the great activities they're doing in Cub Scouting.
- Instead of taking a one-and-done approach to recruiting, think of it as a continuous process that goes well beyond the first meeting.
- Make sure they don't feel left behind. There will be some need for new members to catch up. Den leaders can champion this effort, but they should use their den chief to help. You might also consider holding one or more additional den meetings for these new members to get them up to speed.





First Aid and CPR Training for Adult Leaders



CPR, AED, and Basic First Aid
Student Handbook

If you're a Cub Scout, Boy Scout, or Venturing Leader with an active outdoor program and/or planning a High Adventure, this is the course for you! It will allow you to meet Tour Plan requirements and "Be Prepared" to handle emergencies.

- Purpose: To train lay responders to overcome any reluctance to act in emergency situations and to recognize and care for life-threatening respiratory or cardiac emergencies. To provide the lay responder with the knowledge and skills necessary in an emergency to help sustain life and to minimize pain and the consequences of injury or sudden illness until professional medical help arrives.
- Certification: Basic First Aid and CPR now 2 Years.
 This is certification by the American Safety and Health Institute recognized by the BSA and the CT DPH. Our own CAPT Steve Coe, Powahay Health and Safety Chairman, will serve as the course Instructor.
- Who can take the Course: Any registered leader (Cub Scout, Scouts BSA, Girl Scout or Venturing). This course has limited enrollment. Pre-enrollment is required.
- Date: Saturday, November 23rd; 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM.





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
