

- Using Stay at Home and COVID-19 Guidelines. Scouts complete these requirements at home on their own and/ or with family members at home.
- Troop Leaders will administer this challenge and verify the requirements are completed.
- Take a photo with a smartphone doing and/or completing the requirement to email to their unit leader.

✓	Challenge Items	Score				
	1. Camp out in your yard Friday or Saturday night. If you lack the camping equipment and/or live an apartment or condo complex you can turn your bedroom into a campsite by turning off electricity in room, operate on battery only devices, sleep on the floor, etc.					
	2. Cook a meal outdoor (use of family outdoor grill permitted): Includes the foods from MyPlate or the current USDA nutritional model. Cook that meal outside with an approved grill or camp stove. Share with your family. Cooking outdoor requirement can be waived and cooked in your kitchen if you lack the facilities to cook outdoors.					
	3. Wildlife Pictures. Get outside and get some pictures and videos of wildlife.					
	 4. Compass/GPS Challenge (you can use the compass and gps found on a smartphone) □ Using a map and compass, complete an orienteering course in your backyard or neighborhood measuring the height and/or width of designated items (tree, tower, canyon, ditch, etc.). Check your Scout Handbook for instructions □ Demonstrate how to use a handheld GPS unit, GPS app on a Smartphone, or other electronic navigation system. Use GPS to find your current location, a destination of your choice, and the route you will take to get there. Check your Scout Handbook for instructions. 					
	5. Soap Carving Create and share a masterpiece made out of a block of soap.
