QUARTERMASTER LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

A Quartermaster candidate must demonstrate that they live by the principles of the Scout Oath and Law in their daily life and that they demonstrate leadership skills. This letter should be based upon your personal interaction with the Quartermaster candidate and should take into consideration your observance of how they exemplify the points listed in the Scout Oath and Law (listed below). **Note: if you are the Religious reference, please write about how the Scout demonstrates their duty to God and is reverent (See 'Reverent' below).** This information will be used by the members of the Quartermaster Board of Review to help assess the Quartermaster candidate. Please note that the contents of this letter will NOT be shown to or discussed with the candidate or with anyone not a member of the Quartermaster Board of Review. Thank you for your cooperation and interest in this matter of great importance to this young adult and to the Scouting program.

THE SCOUT OATH

On my Honor, I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law; To help other people at all times; to keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight.

THE SCOUT LAW

A Scout is:

TRUSTWORTHY. A Scout tells the truth. They keep their promises. Honesty is a part of their code of conduct. People can always depend on them.

LOYAL. A Scout is true to their family, friends, Scout leaders, school, nation, and world community.

HELPFUL. A Scout is concerned about other people. They are willingly volunteers to help others without expecting payment or reward.

FRIENDLY. A Scout is a friend to all. They seek to understand others. They respect those with ideas and customs that are different from their own.

COURTEOUS. A Scout is polite to everyone regardless of age or position. They know that good manners make it easier for people to get along together.

KIND. A Scout understands there is strength in being gentle. They treat others as they want to be treated. They do not harm or kill anything without reason. OBEDIENT. A Scout follows the rules of their family, school, and troop. They obey the laws of their community and country. If they think these rules and laws are unfair, they try to have them changed in an orderly manner rather than disobey them.

CHEERFUL. A Scout looks for the bright side of life. They cheerfully perform tasks that come their way. They try to make others happy.

THRIFTY. A Scout works to pay their way and to help others. They save for the future. They protect and conserve natural resources. They carefully use time and property.

BRAVE. A scout can face danger even if they are afraid. They have the courage to stand for what they think is right even if others laugh at or threaten them.

CLEAN. A Scout keeps their body and mind fit and clean. They go around with those who believe in living by these same ideals. They help keep their home and community clean.

REVERENT. A Scout is reverent toward God. They are faithful in their religious duties. They respect the beliefs of others.
