May 31 COVID-19 Update

- Governor Lamont's latest Executive Order 7TT, allowed for an increase in group sizes in Connecticut. Effective June 1, outdoor gatherings may be as large as 25 people and indoor gatherings as large as ten people. These limits apply to Scouting activities as well. Remember, all BSA Youth Protection guidelines must be followed.
- Additionally, the Council Service Center will reopen on a limited basis beginning June 1 with only staff permitted in the building. As always, our staff is available via email and phone, which you can find here. The Scout Shop will reopen later in June which we will communicate as it becomes available.
- We know you're eager to begin visiting our great camps and enjoy the outdoors. Our team is working on a plan to safely reopen our camps. We will share more information with you in the next week, so stay tuned to your email and www.ctyankee.org for details.

National fees will take effect with the upcoming school year, August 1, 2020, for new members. Also effective August 1, 2020, all new members of Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouts will be charged a new, one-time \$25 national joining-fee. There is no joining-fee for Exploring participants, participants previously registered in any BSA program, those transferring from one program to another, council-paid memberships, or adult volunteers.

The updated Council fees are effective with the new charter year.



Best Practices for Collecting Annual Registration Fees...

- Budget Maintain and publish an Annual Unit Budget
- Consider an Early Bird Reduce Registration fee to collect now. This will help to chase down registrations in the fall and provides for early commitment for the new program year.
- Allow for payment plan options.
- Sell Popcorn -- Set-up Individual Scout Accounts so Scouts can earn money towards registration fee and unit activities.

The Unit Treasurer

- Your unit should have a treasurer who manages the income and expenses of the unit. This should never be the Scoutmaster, Cubmaster or Crew Advisor.
- This is an extremely important role in a unit and should be reviewed each year. Your Treasurer should be active in the unit attending unit meetings as needed and providing financial updates.
