Youth Protection & Cyber Chip

All Youth Protection Guidelines will be followed during camp operations. All merit badge Counselors will have current YPT certifications.

- All youth protection policies apply in our online environment. One-on-one online contact between a merit badge counselor and a youth will not be allowed.
- All aspects of the Scouting program are open to observation by parents.
- We will use unique meeting identification numbers for each session. Do not share with others.
- We will utilize password features for all meetings.
- Do not publish meeting invitations via public forums and remind attendees not to pass along invitations.
- Scouts must use the email that was provided during the registration process.
- We will use the "waiting room" features to manage letting individuals into the LIVE session.
- We will disable features that you will not need, such as screen-sharing by non-hosts, private chats, etc.
- LIVE sessions will not be recorded.
- All personal information will be kept within the learning platform. Only merit badge records will be shared with the Scout's troop.
- If a Scout is participating in the *Minecraft* Firebird Challenge, they will need to provide their user name/gamer tag.
- Camp Phoenix participation waiver must be signed by the Scout and their parent/guardian. Submit to <u>Camp-phoenix@ctyankee.org</u>

Advancement Program

Overview

Camp Phoenix is proud to offer a wide variety of advancement opportunities for Scouts to enjoy this summer. For Scouts new to the Scouts BSA program, we are excited to provide our Trailblazers "A Path to First Class" program. For experienced Scouts, we are offering 60 merit badges, 11 of which are Eagle required. Scouts will have the option to take up to 5 merit badges during their week of camp. If Scouts are eager to earn more merit badges this summer they can sign up for additional weeks of camp at a discounted rate. Many of the merit badges will be able to be completed during the week. Some badges, like the Eagle required merit badges, will require additional time outside of the allotted time on the schedule. Make sure you check out all the requirements for your merit badges not just the prerequisites, supplies list, and additional comments section on the merit badge list at least one week prior to your session so you can plan your week of camp.

Trailblazers "A Path to First Class"

Scouts will learn basic Scout skills while working on rank requirements in Tenderfoot through First Class. Topics of instruction will include knots, first aid, physical activities, and many more. Scouts will also have an opportunity to work on Art & Finger Printing merit badges during the first afternoon session at 2:00 pm. This program will offer on-demand sessions Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday and LIVE sessions on Tuesday & Friday. All sessions will run daily from 9:00 - 12:00 pm. We do not sign off in books. Scouts need to work with their troop leadership for signatures.

Merit Badge Schedule

Camp Phoenix is proud to offer 60 merit badges covering various areas of interest including 11 Eagle required merit badges. Scouts can select up to 5 merit badges during their week of camp. Each merit badge will have instruction from a trained merit badge counselor. Each session of instruction will last up to but no longer than 50 minutes each day. On Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday Scouts will watch on demand merit badge instruction. This provides a flexible schedule so Scouts can complete the requirements at their own pace, allow them to get active with Firebird Challenges, and get outdoors. On Tuesday and Friday merit badge classes will be LIVE for each merit badge at the times listed below. This will provide Scouts an opportunity to connect with their merit badge counselor while completing requirements. Scouts can sign up for merit badges when they register for camp. Check out the opportunities below.

A Scout is Reverent. On Wednesday at 1:00 pm Scouts will have the opportunity to attend a LIVE Duty to God Religious service led by a faith leader. Scouts will be able to participate by volunteering to lead a reading. Sign up in advance if you'd like to participate.

Closing Campfires

The Staff of Camp Phoenix is excited to provide a very entertaining Campfire to wrap up your week of camp. Sit back, relax, and enjoy the show! Scouts participating in the Firebird challenges may be selected to show off their Scouting Spirit by having their favorite song or skit included in the campfire. Awards & Recognition

Camp Phoenix will hold its end of the week Closing Ceremony during Friday night's closing campfire. Scouts, patrols, and troops who participate in the Firebird Challenge will be recognized for their achievements. Recognitions include the Firebird Challenge Award, Honor Patrol Award, and Honor Unit Award. Check out some of our favorite memories from the week as we celebrate a fun week of camp.

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Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How many merit badges can a Scout work on in one week of camp?

A: Scouts can work on up to 5 merit badges during their week of camp.

Q: When is the camp fee due?

A: Non-refundable \$50 deposit is due at the time of registration. Full payment is due 2 weeks prior to the Scout's week of Camp Phoenix.

Q: Are there any extra or hidden costs when I register a Scout for camp?

A: Some merit badges may use items you already have at home or may require you to borrow or buy items. Please refer to the list of *Merit Badges Prerequisites, Supplies, & Comments* in the participant's guide as well as the merit badge pamphlet.

Q: How many weeks of camp can a Scout attend?

A: A Scout can attend as many weeks as they would like.

Q: What if I can't attend the week I signed up for?

A: We will be happy to reschedule you to another week. Submit request to <u>camp-phoenix@ctyankee.org</u>

Q: Are troops allowed to sign up or is it only on an individual basis?

A: Due to the specific information needed during registration, it is recommended that Scouts sign up as individuals. We encourage Scouts in the same troop to sign up for the same week of camp to share in the camaraderie and work together on the Firebird Challenges.

Q: Is a Scout guaranteed to earn 5 merit badges in a week or will they be given partials?

A: Some merit badges have time requirements that go beyond your week of camp. Some badges may also require additional time outside of the established merit badge sessions to complete the badge in the week. Please refer to the list of *Merit Badges Prerequisites, Supplies, & Comments* in the participant's guide as well as the merit badge pamphlet.

Q: What is the time commitment during the week beyond the proposed schedule?

A: The time commitment varies by merit badge, the requirement options the Scout chooses, the Scout's prior content knowledge or experience with the topics covered in the merit badge, and activities the participate in. Please refer to the list of *Merit Badges Prerequisites, Supplies, & Comments* in the participant's guide as well as the merit badge pamphlet.

Q: I have one Scout who wants to participate in everything, but their sibling only wants to do one merit badge. Can he/she just "piggy-back" on his/her sibling's class?

A: Sorry, no, only Scouts registered for Camp Phoenix will be able to participate and complete requirements. We encourage family members to 'attend' the closing campfire and awards ceremony Friday evening.
