COVID-19 GUIDELINES

Please follow the updated CT Yankee Council Covid-19 Guidelines, effective September 1, 2021.

These updated guidelines reflect changes to requirements last published on May 20, 2021, for Units in Connecticut Yankee Council and for other organizations using Council camps. It is recommended and encouraged that all members who are eligible get vaccinated for COVID-19.

The deadline for registration is October 13th, 2021. All registrations are final and no refunds will be given unless the Camporee is canceled.

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DETAILS

The D & D Camporee will consist of 6 quests all pertaining to various Scout skills. Patrols will rotate through all the quests, and get scores for the tasks they complete. Scouts BSA troops are encouraged to invite, and host Arrow of Light Scouts to join them in this adventure.

OVERNIGHT CAMPING

Please follow the updated CT Yankee Council guidelines for overnight camping applicable to the camporee:

While it is recommended to sleep 1 person per tent, it is acceptable to camp with a maximum of 2 people per tent.

When sharing a tent, lean-to, individuals should not sleep closer than 6 feet from one another. Individuals sleeping near one other or in bunk beds should sleep head-to-toe

** All units will be assigned to a campsite after the close of registration.*

COOKING RECOMMENDATIONS

All safe handling and sanitization practices for preparing food should be rigorously observed.

Face masks should be worn when preparing or handling food for others.

Mess kits and utensils should not be shared.

Participants should follow social distancing guidelines while eating.

CHECK IN

Check in will be on Friday, October 15, 2021, from 6:30pm-7:30pm at the Pisani Pavilion.

All unit Leaders will be required to check and have each Scout and adult fill out the COVID-19 form attached. Also, all unit Leaders must have a Part A and B of the BSA medical forms for the participants in their troop.

CAMPORTEE EQUIPMENT LIST

Scouts should be prepared with all their appropriate personal gear that they will need for a weekend camping trip. In addition, patrols are required to have the following items with them as they complete the quests throughout the day. The following items are mandatory and must be with your Patrol at all times:

- ◆ *Masks (worn at all times when indoors whether you are vaccinated or not. They are also required to be worn outside when social distancing is not possible)*
- ◆ *Tote-n-Chip Card (required for any Scout using a knife, hatchet, axe or saw)*
- ◆ *Firem'n Chit Card (required for any Scout building a fire)*
- ◆ *Water Bottle*
- ◆ *Hand Sanitizer*

WEATHER

Fall weather in Connecticut can range from very warm to very cold. Adventurers must Be Prepared for all weather.

PARKING

All cars must be parked in the main parking lot located at the entrance of camp. You may designate one vehicle to transport gear to your campsite for your group. This vehicle must return to the main parking lot after dropping off gear. Please do not stop or park along road. It will block access by others.

FACILITIES

All campsites and activities during the day will be located in South Sequassen. Opening ceremony will be at Clark Field.


Bathroom facilities are latrines in each campsite. The water will be turned off in camp. There is a fresh water supply located at the pump in the main parking lot across from the ranger's house.

Trash must be packed out of campsites. There is a dumpster near the rear of the dining hall. Remember to practice Leave No Trace principles with your unit.

CAMPFIRE PROGRAM

We will be having a Campfire Program that will be held at the waterfront in conjunction with the Webelos WOW happening the same weekend. All units will be asked to perform a song or skit. We will have a sign up for this at the registration station.
