

Scatacook District Weather Cancellation Policy



The District Key 3 and those responsible for an event from District Staffing will best determine if a delay start or cancellation of a District Activity is needed based on the following:

- Weather alerts and warnings
- o Driving conditions
- Availability of district staffing
- Ability to run program
- \circ $\;$ Weather related and other conditions at the location

Procedures:

The delay or cancellation of an event will be announced by
12pm Friday unless circumstances require an earlier cancellation

- Emails will be sent to Scoutmasters and we will post a notice on the Council Website.
- If we move forward with a district activity under potential travel advisory conditions, Unit Leadership is responsible to determine safe driving conditions for their unit and if their Scouts are prepared to meet the challenges of the pending weather. If a Troop has any concerns, please stay home and be save.

This policy has been endorsed by Scatacook's District Chairman, District Commissioner, Council Area Staff, District Committee, and Commissioner Staff.

Parking

Please park in designate parking locations, keeping the Troop Trailer Parking spots available. Each vehicle entering the Hoyt Scout Reservations lots **MUST** have a parking pass printed with the information written legibly and displayed on the dashboard.

Summary of Stations

Morning Events

- **Snowy Sights:** Looks like a snow storm is brewing. Try to keep your eye on the target as the flurries roll through!
- Ice Cold Archery: Temperatures are getting low. Test your skill with a bow as your fingertips feel the breeze!
- **Tundra Tomahawks:** You have to gather some firewood to keep the stove running. Split the target in your most accurate fashion to keep your team warm!
- **Beanbag Curling:** The zamboni service has gone to shreds. With the ice unavailable, use your backyard skills to get that beanbag in the hole!

Afternoon Events

• **Scatacook Biathlon:** Zoom and boom! This multifaceted event has your team working to beat the clock. Move that sled and hit that target to bring your team to victory!

- Lost in an Avalanche: You're backcountry skiing on what looks to be a safe trail. Little did you know, the mountains were a bit too fragile today. The mere rumble of your buddy's chili-filled stomach disrupts the slopes and the snow comes crashing down. It's time for you to treat the rest of your crew!
- **Figure Skating Fiasco:** You and your mates are playing pond hockey. A Scout skates off to grab the missing puck and magnificently falls through the ice. It is your job to save them before the time runs out!
- **Lighting the Way:** The Klondike torch has gone out. It is now your job to light the way. Work with your team to build up a hot enough fire to revive this iconic Scatacook symbol.
- **Scatacook Village:** Looks like a polar bear came prancing through the village. Point out what's wrong with the nearby campsite and answer some fun trivia questions along the way!
- **Beijing Teambuilding:** The Scatacook Winter Games are all about getting things done as a team. Work with your patrol to overcome the challenge presented to you!

Klondike Games Prep

Troop Camping Reminders

- Make sure the scouts are prepared for cold weather activities
- Pavilions are for program use only
- Pack in pack out
- Vehicles are not permitted beyond the parking lot. This includes troop trailers
- Running water is available near the cabin area
- Bring your own firewood. Not all campsites have fire rings. Be prepared and bring your own
- Check-out –campsite properly cleaned, fire extinguished, and picnic tables returned to original location

Health and Safety

- Health officer located at the pump house during event
- Warming stations:
 - Training cabin (during the day)
 - Pump house (Friday 5pm Saturday 6pm)
- Troops staying overnight Saturday are responsible for the health and safety of their scouts.

Lunch

- Lunch can be had in the campsites rather than scouts needing foil packs
- Units without sites can use the complimentary fire rings available in the field to cook their lunches


Klondike Derby Sled: Guide to Build Your Own

Approximate Dimensions:


- \circ HEIGHT = 40 inches
- LENGTH = 6 feet 0
- WIDTH = 18 inches. 0

Recommendations:

- Paint your sled bright colors
- Varnish the bottom of the runners; WAX **BEFORE USE!**
- Add a canvas snow curtain to keep equipment dry.
- Lace the sides with nylon rope to keep equipment from falling off the sled.
- Use screws instead of nails and pre-drill pilot holes to prevent splitting. Use glue in addition to screws.
- An old set of downhill skis or PVC pipe

works well as runners.

 Mount a pole on your sled to fly your patrol flag!

 Use hardwoods such as maple, oak or ash to make your sled. Pine is too soft

How it Works

Scoring

A scoring sheet will be provided to each patrol.

Points will be awarded based on how well Scouts:

- Perform their assigned task
- Demonstrate:
 - Leadership
 - Teamwork
 - Scout Spirit
 - Scout Skills

There will be random opportunities to earn extra points throughout the event.

Order of Events

- Morning events will be individual or pair events. Patrols will assign scouts to the events.
- Afternoon events will be patrol events
 - Scouts will be given a map with an assigned route to the stations.
 - o Stations must be completed in the specific order

Adult Involvement

- Scouts BSA:
 - o Adult leaders may accompany each Scout Patrol
 - Penalties will be awarded if adults attempt to assist their scouts (except in extraordinary circumstances)
 - \circ Adults should only get involved if a health or safety issue arises
- Venturer Crews or Senior Scouts BSA (Star, Life, and Eagle)
 - o Adults should **not** accompany these sleds

- Webelos Dens
 - Leaders (and other Parents) are considered part of the Den and should accompany each sled
 - May assist their scouts without penalty
 - Encouraged to let scouts perform as much of an event as they are capable
 - Bonus points may be awarded for independent performances
