

Merit Badge Essentials

With over 50 merit badges to choose from, Camp Sequassen has one of the most robust merit badge programs of any camp. 

Campsites

Camp Sequassen has fourteen canvas tent, and adirondack style shelter campsites. Each campsite has a pavilion, fire ring, flag pole, latrine with a sink, potable water, and is located close to one of three centrally located shower houses. Each tent site also has 1 or 2 adirondack style shelters.

Dining Hall

Scouts are served fantastic, nutritious meals each day in our full service family style dining hall. Our professionally catered kitchen has been described as unmatched in quality and consistency, and is regarded as one of the best camp dining experiences in the region.



Trading Post

Everyone enjoys a pause to refresh or pick up a few necessities. The average camper spends approximately \$50 per week while at summer camp for merit badge books, project kits, and other essentials such as camp T-shirts, hats, ice cream, snacks, and slushies!



95 Years of Service

This year marks the 95th anniversary of Camp Sequassen and what an incredible 95 years it has been! From a wooded property with little more than a waterline and the ruins of a hermit's shack, Camp Sequassen has grown into one of the most beautiful and well-maintained Scout camps in the Northeastern United States. During all these years, Scouts and Scouters have invested their creative and physical energy into developing a camp where Scouting can be learned, lived, and enjoyed just as Sir Baden Powell envisioned.

Every Scout deserves a week of summer camp and a campership ensures that they can attend no matter the circumstance. Financial assistance, based on need, is available for all Scouts. The campership application is available on sequassen.org. and is due by May 1, 2022.

Medical Clearance

A current BSA physical evaluation signed (not stamped) by a licensed physician, physician's assistant, or nurse practitioner within 12 months is required for all Scouts and adults. The BSA physical form parts A-C are available on sequassen.org.



Additional pages are included in the downloadable packet which must be completed to comply with State of Connecticut requirements, and must accompany the BSA physical.
