Camp Physicals

We are rapidly approaching the heavy camping season. In just a few months you and your unit will be going on many big camping trips. Whether it is a trip to one of the high adventure bases, summer camp or even just a week-long trip with your unit an annual physical will be required. Now is good time to schedule an appointment with your doctor to have your annual physical. An annual physical is required anytime you will be taking part in an event that is 72 hours or longer. The BSA has an approved medical form that you will need to provide your doctor to fill out for these events. The forms can be found at the BSA's Annual Health and Medical Record site at https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/ ahmr/. Depending on where you end up going you may require additional medical related forms as well. If you are going to a national BSA location, this site will include these additional forms. If you are going to a local site, visit their website to ensure no additional paperwork is needed. Make sure that you get your appointment scheduled now, as summer approaches it can take over a month to get an appointment and if you can't have your physical completed before your event it will be unlikely that you will be able to participate. So, please plan ahead and call your doctor's office now to ensure that your physical will be completed before any event that will require a medical record this year.

2022 POMPERAUG DISTRICT PINEWOOD DERBY CHAMPIONSHIP

Date: Saturday, April 23, 2022, Race starts at 3 PM with check-in and weighing starts at 2:00 PM

Place: First Presbyterian Church of Fairfield, 2475 Easton Tpke, Fairfield, CT

Registration Deadline: All packs must be registered by April 18th

Entry Fee: \$40.00 per Pack – Each Pack may enter 1 car per rank. If the top 2 racers in the Pack are from the same rank the Pack may enter 1 additional car. Cars entered should be the top cars from your Pack competitions. Substitutions may be made in case an entered Scout cannot attend.

Includes: Patches for all and trophies for top three finishers.

The Races: ALL cars will run multiple heats, in alternating lanes. Cars are assigned to heats randomly. Winner determined by shortest overall time.

Rules: A copy of the rules is attached. The rules may be slightly different than those used by an individual Pack. Cars that do not meet the specifications <u>will be not be allowed entry / disqualified</u>. We do not want to disappoint any Scouts so please read the attached rules carefully and MAKE SURE your cars meet the specifications. Any questions on the rules and specifications prior to the race can be directed to Seth Strohecker (203) 816-1683 or <u>seth.strohecker@gmail.com</u>

Check-in: All cars will be inspected at time of check-in. In the event of a problem with a car, the racer will have an opportunity to bring it into compliance (if possible). Once cars are checked in, there is no access to it until after the race. In the event of a dispute, the decision of the race committee is final. Cars and boxes should be marked with the scouts name, Pack and rank.

Attendance and Spectator: There may be gathering restrictions in place at the time of the event. If this is the case any attendance limitations will be communicated prior to the event.

Concession Stand: Snack will be available to purchase at the event. Proceeds will support the CT Yankee Council

Attire: All Scouts should be in class A uniforms. All attendees will be required to wear a face mask at all times and socially distance whenever possible.

2022 Pomperaug District Pinewood Derby Championship Rules

General Rules:

• You must use the Official BSA Pinewood Derby Kit. No other body, axles or Wheels will be accepted.

The car MUST have been created in the year that the race is taking place (Unless explicitly permitted by the Racemaster)

The car MUST have been created by the CUB SCOUT racing it

As each car is registered, it will be weighed in and checked for the following inspection points:

Pinewood Derby Car Dimensions:

- · The overall length of the car shall not exceed 7 inches.
- $\cdot~$ The overall width of the car shall not exceed 2 3/4 inches.
- The car must have 1 3/4" clearance between the wheels.
 - The car must have 3/8" clearance underneath the body so it does not rub on the track
- · The car must not be taller than 3" tall
 - The wheel-base (distance between the front and rear axles) may not be changed from the kit body distance of 41/4 (4.250) to 4 5/8 (4.625) inches.

Derby Car Weight

- · The car weight shall not exceed 5.00 ounces.
- · The official race scale that is used at car check-in shall be considered final.

Wood, Wheels and Axles

- The official pine wood block must be used. The block may be shaped in any way that is desired.
- Official BSA wheels must be used. The wheels may not be cut, drilled, beveled or rounded. You may only remove the seams and imperfections from the wheels. (The new kits do NOT have seams to repair. Excessive sanding will be considered "lathing" and may be disqualified based on decision of the racemaster.)
- $\cdot\;$ The official nail axles must be used and may not be altered except for polishing and lubrication
- · Dry lubricant is the only type of lubricant that will be allowed

Car Modifications Not Allowed

- Wheel bearings, washers or bushings are prohibited
- The car must not ride on any type of springs
- · No starting devices. The car must be freewheeling.
- $\cdot\;$ No liquids or loose material of any kind, such as lead shot, may be used.

Other Pinewood Derby Race Rules

- · Once a car passes inspection and is entered into the race, only race committee members can touch it.
- · If the car loses a wheel, or is otherwise damaged, the racer shall have 5 minutes to make a repair
- · Each car must pass inspection by the official inspection committee before it will be allowed to compete.
- · Lubrication must be done before arrival (no graphite allowed in Race site)
- The Inspection Committee has the responsibility to disqualify those cars that do not meet these specifications. All decisions of the Racemaster are final
- Ungentlemanly or unsportsmanlike conduct by any participant or spectator will be grounds for expulsion from the competition or the race area.

Below is a portion of the Council email in regards to the registration increase.

New fees are effective August 1, 2021.

Both on the National and Council level, the Boy Scouts of America has worked hard to keep annual membership fees as low as possible but with rising costs and FOS participation declining, the fees for Connecticut Yankee Council will be as follows for 2022 re-charter:

\$72 National Membership fee for Cub Scouts/Scouts BSA/ Venturing/ Sea Scouts.

\$45 National Membership fee for Explorers.

\$45 National Membership fee for Adult Volunteers .

\$25 National one-time joining for Cub Scouts/Scouts BSA/ Venturing/Sea Scouts.

\$48 Council Operations fee for CubScouts/Scouts BSA/ Venturing.\$12 Council Operations fee for AdultVolunteers.

\$12 Council Insurance fee for youth and volunteers .

Connecticut Yankee Council will continue to accept for consideration, confidential Operations Fee waiver forms requesting assistance from families that are unable to pay the Operations Fee. It is our intention that all youth will always be able to participate in our programs, regardless of economic circumstances.

Connecticut Yankee Council COVID-19 Guidelines Updated 03/01/2022

BASED UPON THE LATEST GUIDANCE FROM THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT, CONNECTICUT YANKEE COUNCIL IS ADOPTING THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES, EFFECTIVE MARCH 1, 2022.

COVID-19 VACCINES CURRENTLY APPROVED OR AUTHORIZED BY FDA ARE EFFECTIVE IN PREVENTING SERIOUS OUTCOMES OF COVID-19, INCLUDING SEVERE DISEASE, HOSPITALIZATION, AND DEATH. A COVID-19 VACCINATION IS CURRENTLY RECOMMENDED FOR EVERYONE FIVE YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER IN THE UNITED STATES FOR THE PREVENTION OF COVID-19.

General Guidance

- The Council is lifting its policy that face masks be worn during indoor activities. The use of face masks by individuals is optional. Proper social distancing should be maintained in all circumstances. Face masks should not be worn in or near water, while eating, or while sleeping.
- Each member should Be Prepared and have clean and dry face masks available to wear, as circumstances dictate. Examples where wearing of masks may be appropriate include places where social distancing is not possible, or first aid stations (where individuals may be ill).
- Units and members must follow any additional guidelines imposed by local municipalities or health departments, building operators, or chartered organizations.
- The BSA "Model Pre-Event Medical Screening Checklist" has been updated, effective January 1, 2022. The Council recommends use of this checklist prior to beginning each activity.

- Unit leaders must report, within 12 hours, confirmed or strongly suspected cases of any communicable disease infection, including COVID-19, occurring during or within 48 hours after a unit meeting or activity, to camping@ctyankee.org. Unit leaders are also required to promptly notify adult leaders and parents of all scouts who participated in the activity, as well as the unit's Chartered Organization Representative.
- Unit leaders are obligated to work closely with their parents and youth members to ensure that no stigma is attached to ANY-ONE who chooses to wear a mask. Bullying, harassment, or similar forms of abuse related to masks, violate the Scout Oath and Law and are unacceptable.

Overnight Camping

- Cabins are available for program use by units, 24/7.
- Group (congregate) sleeping inside cabins or other indoor locations is permitted.
- While it is a best practice to sleep one person per tent, unit leaders may determine whether to permit additional number of individuals to share a tent.
- Parental permission should be obtained by the unit leader for each youth member sleeping in a cabin with others or sharing a tent.
- When sharing a cabin, tent or lean-to, individuals sleeping next to one another or in bunk beds should be arranged head-to-toe.
- Any member using a CPAP machine <u>must not</u> share a cabin, tent, or lean-to with other members.

Connecticut Yankee Council COVID-19 Guidelines for Carpooling Recommended Best Practices March 1, 2022

Connecticut Yankee Council recommends youth members be transported to and from an activity only by their own family member (parent or guardian).

Parental permission should be obtained by the unit leader for each youth member traveling in a vehicle with anyone other than a family member.

Unit leaders must maintain a list of passengers in each vehicle for 48 hours after completion of a trip, to facilitate contact tracing.

Should a unit decide to use carpooling to and from Scouting activities, the following best practices are recommended:

- Driver and passengers wear a clean and dry face mask while inside the vehicle.
- Open windows or use the vehicle's vent system to increase air circulation.
- Passengers stay in the same vehicle for all portions of the trip, including the return trip.
- Leave open seats between passengers, especially for longer trips (over one hour).
