Youth must be a registered Scout or Venturer to participate in the Camporee.

Two Unit Leaders are required to be responsible for all youth accompanying a unit. All leaders are required to have current youth protection training.

Upon arrival at camp, each Unit Leader must present the Unit roster at Check-In. Each unit will be given an activity rotation schedule at the PLC. Patrols must follow the assigned rotation to receive full credits.

## Camping

- Parking: Parking in designated areas only. No vehicles in campsites!
- Campsites: Campsites will be assigned at Check-In.
- PLC: There will be a mandatory PLC Friday night at 9:00 p.m.  
  
All senior patrol leaders and unit leaders should be in attendance.  
Units will receive patrol activity rotations.  
  
Units in attendance will receive 5 credits
- Uniform: Class A uniform for morning colors and inspection.
- Rules: All Scouting regulations will prevail
- Water: Available in camp
- Equipment: Bring necessary equipment for camping and cooking.

Demonstrate teamwork and scout spirit.

Demonstrate knot knowledge and skill.

## **Tatooine Dust Storm**

Demonstrate teamwork, communication, and scout spirit.

## **Gamorrean Battle-Ax Training**

Demonstrate hatchet throwing skills and safety.

## **Medical Droid Certification**

Demonstrate first aid knowledge and skills.

## **Food Quest**

Demonstrate orienteering skills and teamwork.
