Introduction

The Hike-o-ree will be focused on advancement, and not competition. There will be requirements for Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First class. As well as a chance for a 15 mile hike for the bolder and more adventurous scouts.

An opportunity to make a trail lunch as a patrol for a cooking merit badge requirement. All hikes are an out and back. The majority of the stations will be on the 5 mile section. This way if a station is busy, the patrol can hike on to the next one and come back later. The 5 mile Hike will cover 2nd class 3a,b,c.

Adult leaders will be required for the 15 mile hike, which will be from Hoyt to Tarywile Park and back. This is geared for the older Scouts that are interested in doing something more than just stations and tying knots.

The cheat for those that do not think they are in top physical shape is to have another leader drive to Tarywile and swap keys. Each adult can get a 7.5 mile hike in.

Location of stations

Some of the stations will be in Hoyt proper, such as the orienteering course, to help stagger the start times. For the most part, stations will be set up along the trail.

Lunch

During lunch break, patrols will be required to eat where they are on the trail. Please make sure the patrols are either set up for a freeze dried option or a bag lunch.

WEATHER

Please make sure the scouts are prepared for fall weather in the northeast. Rain gear (raincoat, poncho, etc.) should be readily available.

In the event of severe weather, an e-mail will be sent to participant contacts. All cancellations will be posted on the Scatacook District Facebook page.

Camping

Units camping will be assigned an area based on the number of tents you indicate as required for your scouts, an appropriate area allocated for adult tents and a general area for setting up a cooking area. Units should check-in upon arrival on Friday at the Jackson pavilion (closest to the parking lot). Camping locations will be assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis as units sign up for the camporee (not as they arrive) and preference will be given to those units who are running a station.

Troops are encouraged to teach Tote 'n' Chip and Fireman chit in their campsites to the younger Scouts. (2nd class 2a,b,c)

Items patrol leaders need for check-in

- Patrol Roster (with skit identified)
- A Scouts name for Flag ceremony that does not have Tenderfoot requirement 7a signed off yet.

Equipment List

The following items are mandatory and must be carried by your patrol during the initial Inspection at the start, throughout, and at the finish of the Hike-o-ree:

- One (1) Compass
- One (1) Scout Handbook (We will have a sign off station at the trailhead.)
- One (1) Knife with one totin' chip
- One (1) patrol first aid kit
- One (1) 6 x 8 tarp- in case of lunch in the rain
- Electronic device to take pictures for scavenger hunt- 2nd class requirement 4, tenderfoot requirement 4b. First class requirement 5a.
- Day pack (each Scout)
- 2 quart water bottles or bladder such as camelback (each Scout)
- Lunch Freeze dried and a trail stove (Second class 2d,e)
- Rain gear (each scout)
- Patrol flag
- Patrol yell or chant
- Garbage bag for trash and discarded items during the competition

CAMPOREE: Special Instructions

- 1. All individuals registered in advance will receive a 2022 Hike-o-ree Patch, each patrol will receive a different colored ribbon for their patrol flag depending on the hike accomplished.
- 2. All Crews and Patrols should check-in Friday evening between 5:00-7:00 PM Dens should check in on Saturday morning between 7:00-8:00 AM (unless they are camping Friday night). Only the Crew Leader, Patrol Leader or Den Leader will check-in at Headquarters. At check-in, each patrol will be given a set of instructions, an assigned starting station, a map of the course and events, and a score sheet.
- 3. Parking is very limited. Carpooling is essential. Please plan accordingly. **Unit Trailers** will be parked at the entrance to lower Hoyt. Guides will be available to help with Parking.
- 4. All trash must be packed out, including trash generated on the trail. Each Crew, Patrol or Den must bring at least one, heavy-duty garbage bag, and use it.

- 5. Event patches will be handed out to each Troop and Pack at the Roundtable following the Camporee. Units must have registered for the camporee and checked in to receive patches.
- 6. Fuel Use See Guide to Safe Scouting.
- 7. No drugs or alcohol permitted at a BSA event. No exceptions.
- 8. The First Aid Station will be at the Ranger Station at lower Hoyt.
- 9. Leave-No-Trace: Please use only existing site fire rings.
