**The On My Honor Award** is a Powahay District recognition presented to volunteers at a Pack, Troop or Crew level. Individuals are nominated by their commissioner or their peers. Nominations do not have to be registered with your unit but must demonstrate Scouting service to your unit. A person can be nominated for consecutive years. Please limit to 4 nominations per unit and invite those nominated to attend the dinner to be recognized. Form Attached.

**District Award of Merit (2 or 3** is the highest award a district can present to a volunteer. It is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level. Form Attached.

**Powahay Key 3 Award** is presented to volunteers who go above and beyond the call of service for the youth of the Powahay District. It is presented by the District Key Three (District Chairman, District Commissioner and District Executive). Recommendations can be submitted by email to any of the Key Three.

**Veteran's Award:** The Veteran's Award is an adult recognition on number of years registered in Scouting. Tenure earned as a youth may be included in the total number of years registered. Form Attached.

**Unit Leader Award of Merit:** The Boy Scouts of America created the Unit Leader Award of Merit to recognize the quality unit leaders — Cubmasters, Scoutmaster or Crew Advisor — who make that happen. This award is approved by National. Form Attached.

**The William D. Boyce New-Unit Organizer Award** is presented to recognize volunteers who organize one or more traditional Scouting units. The Award has been updated allowing for several volunteers to be recognized. Form Attached.

**Powahay Pioneer Award** is presented annually by the Powahay District to long time Scouters who continue to provide exceptional service to Scouting at a point in their life when they could easily "retire" from Scouting. Recipients are selected by special committee.

During our Scouting year, many situations arise when you say "thank you" to a volunteer. However, sometimes a more than just a thank you is needed to match the impact of the person's efforts. Powahay's Annual Recognition Dinner allows your unit to thank a volunteer with a recognition award and to be honored at a ceremony of their peers. We ask that please you make every effort for those nominated to attend the District Dinner.

## The On My Honor Service to Youth Award Nomination Form

The "On My Honor ... Service to Youth Award" is a Powahay District recognition presented to volunteers at a Pack, Troop or Crew level. Individuals are nominated by their commissioner or their peers *for exceptional service to the unit*. A framed certificate is presented at the District Dinner.

Criteria: Any adult – Unit Leaders, Assistant Leaders, Committee Chair, Committee members, Den Leaders, parents or member of the charter organization that provide exceptional service or leadership to your unit.

- 1. No more than 4 nominations per unit.
- 2. Nominations do not have to be registered with your unit but must demonstrate Scouting service to your unit
- 3. A person can be nominated for consecutive years.
- 4. The Award will be presented at the District Dinner, Wednesday, June 7, 2023 (please select volunteers that can attend the district dinner).

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils.

The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level.

The award is made available annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 traditional units or fraction thereof. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year.

It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award.

A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on *volunteer* service.

#### REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A nominee must be a registered Scouter.
- 2. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, or both.

Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time.

- 3. Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
- 4. The nominee's attitude toward and cooperation with the district and/or council is to be taken into consideration.
- 5. Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.

#### **PROCEDURE**

- Annually, district chairmen will appoint a temporary special District Award of Merit committee of not more than five persons who
  will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the council through the Scout executive.
- 2. The Scout executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the council committee.
- 3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
  - a. The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
  - b. A district and/or council officer should explain the award and its significance.
  - Eagle Scouts or Silver Award Venturers should be asked to escort the recipients to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
  - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.
  - e. The award (certificate, No. 33719; plaque, No. 17565; and lapel pin, No. 17551) may be presented at this time with appropriate congratulations.
  - f. The only uniform insignia which accompanies this award is an embroidered overhand knot, No. 05013.
  - g. A group picture may be taken for use in neighborhood or community newspapers (district responsibility).

#### Unit Leader Award of Merit

### Background

Quality unit leadership is the key to a quality unit program—and it leads to better Scout retention. Statistics show that if young people stay engaged in the program for at least five years, the BSA's influence likely will stay with them for the rest of their lives. A quality Scouting experience will help keep Scouts in the program, and the Boy Scouts of America created the Unit Leader Award of Merit to recognize the quality unit leaders who make that happen.

The Unit Leader Award of Merit replaces the Scoutmaster, Varsity Team Coach, and Venturing Crew Advisor award of merit programs. This new recognition has revised requirements, and Cubmasters and Skippers are also eligible for this recognition.

#### Requirements

The nominee must

- Be a currently registered Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Coach, Advisor, or Skipper who has served in that position at least 18 continuous months.
- 2. Meet the training requirements for the registered position.
- 3. Distribute a printed or electronic annual unit program plan and calendar to each family in the unit.
- 4. Have a leader succession plan in place.
- Effectively use the advancement method so that at least 60 percent of the unit's youth have advanced at least once during the last 12 months.
- 6. Cultivate a positive relationship with the chartered organization.
- 7. Project a positive image of Scouting in the community.

#### Nomination Procedure

- The unit committee chair completes the Unit Leader Award of Merit Nomination Form on behalf of the unit committee. For Boy Scout troops, Varsity Scout teams, Venturing crews, and Sea Scout ships, the nomination must include endorsement by the senior patrol leader, team captain, crew president, or ship's boatswain, respectively.
- 2. The unit or district commissioner certifies that the form is complete.
- 3. The unit submits the nomination form to the council for approval by the Scout executive and council commissioner or president. The council is resposible for processing the award.

#### The Award

Upon receipt of the approved nomination form, the council may present the Unit Leader Award of Merit, which includes a certificate, square knot with the appropriate device, and a special unit leader emblem. Recognition of this achievement may be presented at appropriate district or council events, such as district or council leader recognition dinners, training events, and board meetings.

The award may be presented to youth for each program, Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts, Venturers, and Sea Scouts, if the individual meets the requirements in each program. Only one knot is worn with the devices of each program that the award was earned in.
