# Background

The Connecticut Yankee Council has had two years of great membership outcomes. In both 2021 and 2022 we grew our membership by over 3%, one of only a very small number of councils who were able to do this. In 2022, the council showed even more success. We showed balanced growth, with every district in the council showing growth and each one of our program areas. we also had the highest retention rate in the nation. We should all be proud of these accomplishments.

However, we cannot rest on the laurels of our past success or our past success will just lead to our future failure. We need to take these recent successes to drive us to continue to improve in the future to ensure continued success.

This document will analyze our recent successes and the current market conditions to determine where the best opportunities for continued success exist for our council. This will also help us keep focused. Our council has relatively small membership team and if we try to pursue every opportunity our team will be so diluted that we will not be effective. This document will help us focus on only those few areas which we can effectively perform.

Recently the National Council has released a new suite of membership tools to help district and councils analyze its membership data, the Council Membership Tools. These tools are a great leap forward from the previous ScoutNet Report, but they are still not enough to give our team all the data it needs to be successful. These reports give great data at the council, district and unit level, but it misses the town level analysis. There are also some very key metrics that are missing from these tools: retention data, Webelos to Scout Transition, and gender breakdown at the unit level. We will need to use these tools and create our own tools to make our team more data driven and therefore more effective with our resources.

# **Annual Goals**

Creating goals is an important part of the membership plan as it shows the areas where we have chosen to focus our resources. Throughout the document the reason why many of these goals are in place should be clear. Some of these goals will be harder to accomplish then others, but all these goals can be accomplished. These goals fall into three major areas: Recruitment, retention and unit support.

# **SWOT Analysis**

# Strengths ScoutReach

The backbone of our council's growth the last two years has been from the scout reach program. In 2021, our ScoutReach program grew almost 30%. In that same year the only traditional scouting district that showed growth was Pomperaug district, and it only showed marginal growth. In 2022, the growth of our scout reach program was similar. This growth has mostly been concentrated in the city of New Haven. We have established a great relationship with both the City and School leadership that has allowed for this explosive growth. Growth of this rate in New Haven cannot be counted on to continue in the long term. With a growth rate this high, we would have every youth in the City of New Haven as part of our program in less than a decade. Instead of counting on this continued growth rate in New Haven, this performance needs to be leveraged to expand this program to other similar areas within our council.

### Retention

Our retention rate for scouts is the highest of all councils in the nation at approximately 85%. Our retention rate has historically been high. It is hard to attribute this to any cause, but this is likely attributed at least in part to our councils great training, camping and activities programs. This helps keep our scouts engaged in scouting. It is also likely to do with the support system we offer our units.

### Weaknesses

### Lions

While 2022 was a great year for membership in almost every way, there was one negative, the Lion program. In 2022, our Lion membership declined by 20%. The previous year the growth rate for the Lion program was approximately 70% and this decline is likely just a reversion to the mean but given these our youngest scouts this program has the longest lasting influence on our program and recruiting scouts in kindergarten is easiest since there is less competition.

### Venturing

Our Venturing program has been on the decline for nearly a decade to the point where the program is nearly extinct within our council. This trend is not just localized to our council but has been seen across the nation. It is unclear what the root cause of this decline has been. Some of the potential causes may include: competition with other activities at age range, lack of differentiation with the Scouts BSA program, and advancement system not being seen as equal an accomplishment to that of Eagle Scout.

#### Recruitment

While the top line numbers for the council were all positive, when digging into the data further issues can be seen that will be detrimental in the long term if not corrected. While the council grew in 2022, this was largely due to our great retention numbers and not because of better recruitment. In 2022, approximately 10% fewer youth were recruited into the Scouting program. The lower recruitment numbers were seen across all our mainstay programs. If this trend continues not even a perfect retention rate would allow the council to continue to grow. This is likely the single biggest hinderance to the long-term prosperity of the council.

#### Webelos to Scout Transition

Another area where the data shows a relative weakness of the council is our Webelos to Scout Transition. In 2022, we only transitioned approximately 40% of Arrow of Light Scouts into the Scouts BSA program. This number is a bit alarming, as they should be the easiest recruits to the Scouts BSA program since they already have an attachment to the Scouting program. Increasing the percentage of scout transition is another way to easily grow our top line membership without having to recruit additional youth, which will be more difficult do to the flat and declining youth population in our area.

### **Opportunities**

### **Urban Areas**

We have shown that we know how to make our program work within an urban environment with our program in New Haven. However, our market share in our other large population centers (Bridgeport, Stamford, Norwalk, and Danbury) all have market share well below those of the surrounding area, around or below 1%. The biggest opportunity in this area is Bridgeport which is the largest city within our council, but also the city with our lowest market share, approximately 0.4%. We can use our successful strategy in New Haven to grow scouting in these other areas.

### Sea Scouts

Our council has recently purchased a sailing camp program in Bridgeport and it has also received a donation of a large boat to help us grow our Sea Scouting program. Given our location right along the Long Island Sound, our council should have a thriving Sea Scouting program throughout our council. However, it is currently only concentrated in a few large coastal communities. We need to leverage these recent acquisitions into growth within this program.

### Latino Outreach

The council has recently begun a relationship with Latinos for Educational Advocacy and Diversity (LEAD) to increase our reach into the Latino Community in Danbury. LEAD is an organization throughout the state of Connecticut. This relationship can be further leveraged to increase our reach into the Latino community throughout our council. Additionally, our

council now has on staff a professional who is fluent in Spanish that will assist in our ability to provide support to this community as well.

#### Threats

#### **Population Growth**

The population of Connecticut is expected to shrink for scouting age youth in the coming years. This means that to grow we will need to capture a higher market share and not just count on population growth to grow our program. This will mean growth will be harder as gaining incremental market share will be harder to achieve then simply maintain our current market share with a growing population.

### **Competing After School Programs**

As we move out of the pandemic more youth program will be opening again. This means there will likely be more competition in the youth development marketplace in the coming years as the world comes back to its pre-pandemic state. Our program was made available throughout the pandemic, and we need to use first mover advantage to continue to grow our program.

### Lack of Unit Level Incentives for Growth

On the unit level there is no real incentive for a unit to grow. There program will largely stay the same regardless of the size of the unit. In fact, there is probably a disincentive for a unit to grow, as a larger unit makes managing a unit more complicated. While this is probably not the view of all units, those adult leaders who are truly bought into the scouting program will want to have as many you involved as possible. It is those leaders with marginal attachment to the program this could be their view. Countering this mindset will be key to getting across the board unit growth. An incentive structure for units to grow could be one possible way to turn this threat into a strength.

# **Strategic Pillars**

Our strategy will depend upon four strategic pillars by which all our goals will revolve. These pillars are Recruit, Retain, Transition, and Data Driven. This comes down to a simple equation:

# Recruitment + Retention + Transition = Growth

### Recruit

Recruitment is the backbone of sustaining our program. Without recruitment our membership would be gone within just a few years. Effective recruitment is the biggest part of our membership plan. As part of this year's membership plan, we will refine our recruitment strategies to make our recruitment seasons even more effective.

### Retain

The second pilar of our membership strategy is retain. Retention is another key factor in growing our membership. This is not only because keeping our base members keeps our membership numbers up, but it also helps us to recruit new members. New members are more likely to join if they see a thriving unit.

### Transition

The transition process is another key pilar to achieving our membership goals. The transition process is one that can easily be glossed over when developing a membership plan. This is important to ensure that none of our units end up with gap years in their membership. One area of this pilar that is often not considered is the transition from a Scouts BSA unit into one of our older scout programs. Focus will be maintained this year on these areas of the transition process.

### Data Driven

Data driven is the last pilar of our strategy. This pilar is the support structure used aid the other three pillars. Data will be used to focus our team to the areas where we will have the most impact. This approach will allow us to both be leaner and nimbler.

# Growing the Team

To continue to grow our membership we must also grow our membership team. On the council level several volunteer positions will be filled this year to align with our strategic initiatives.

Autonomy will be given to the district teams to form their teams in the manner which they feel will best suit the needs of their districts. However, they should work with the council membership team to ensure that the entire team is aligned. District membership Chair's should work with the Council Vice-President of Membership to determine the correct composition of the district membership team, but final determination of the team will be left to the district chair.

### Latino Outreach Chair

With our recent partnership LEAD in Danbury, we must develop a more comprehensive strategy to reach the Latino community. This role will work with the professional staff to develop a comprehensive approach to recruit and retain members of the Latino community. This will include developing recruitment materials in Spanish.

#### Sea Scout Membership Chair

Our recent purchase of the Sail Away School in Bridgeport and the recent donation of a large boat has poised our council for large growth in our Sea Scouting program. A comprehensive

strategy must be developed to capitalize on these recent investments. In this role, the volunteer will work with the council's older youth program professional to develop a comprehensive strategy to grow Sea Scouting. This will include determining communities to best develop new Ships, potential charter partners and recruitment strategies for new scouts.

### **Girl Recruitment Chair**

It has been five years since the BSA first welcomed girls into the Cub Scout program. Some units have been able to grow the girls well while others have not. We have also had a great success creating many new girl Scouts BSA units when the program was first established in 2019. With the Cub Scout Pack's now getting better at recruiting girls, there are likely places where we have girl Cub Scouts who have no local Scouts BSA unit to transition to. In this role the volunteer will be responsible for identify towns with mismatches in the Cub Scout Girls and Scouts BSA girls' units and work to establish new Scouts BSA girl units within these towns. They will also be responsible for surveying Cub Scout units with large girl populations to determine best practices in recruiting Cub Scout girls.

### Webelos to Scout Chair

The Webelos to Scout transition rate has fallen far below our retention rate. Intuitively this should not be the case as Arrow of Light scouts are likely to have been with the program for several years and therefore should have an affinity for our program. This would suggest that is a flaw in our Webelos to Scout Transition program. Therefore, a council Webelos to Scout Transition Chair will be appointed. This volunteer's sole job will be to focus on the Webelos to Scout Transitioning into a local troop, answering questions they may have and follow up with all families who do not transition to determine the reason. This will be used in subsequent years to formulate a plan to increase the transition rate. They will also be tasked with putting together a Webelos to Scout Transition guide for families.

# Annual Membership Plan – Accomplishing Our Goals

With the current state of membership now understood and the alignment of the team defined, each of the 2023 goals will be looked at in detail to determine the strategy to meet each of these goals.

### Grow membership in each district by 3%

Growing our membership by 3% for a third year in a row seems like a hard task, but it is one that is entirely achievable. With our year end membership and number of units in the council to get 3 % growth, on average units would just need to recruit one more scout in 2023 then it did in 2022. When framed in this manner this seems much more achievable.

This will not happen in every unit, so our team will need to focus on specific areas in each district that are lagging the surrounding areas. More details about what areas will be the areas

of focus and the strategies for achieving this growth will be detailed in under the grow Cub Scout and Scouts BSA membership by 3% goal.

# Grow membership in Cub Scouts and Scouts BSA by 3%

The first step to growing our Cub Scout and Scouts BSA membership will be to talk to the top 10% of packs and troops for recruitment to determine what strategies they employed to recruit new scouts. These strategies will then be incorporated into our recruitment guides for packs and troops.

The next step will be to identify all the grade schools within our council's boundary and determine which units are actively recruiting from these schools. Any school that does not have a unit actively recruiting from it will be identified and a current unit will be asked to start recruiting there (with the assistance of the council membership team) or they will be targeted for new unit formation.

Scouts BSA units also need be encouraged to do recruitment of new scouts instead of just relying on Webelos to Scout transition. This will likely be a big change for most units, and change does not come easy. Incentives will be considered to push troops into starting down this new recruitment path. This incentive does not need to be particularly large to be effective, but the incentive does need to be meaningful. Potential incentive may include a free weekend of a camping at a council camp, free rank advancement for a year, discounts for adults to attend summer camp, etc. This incentive will be determined in consultation with the council leadership.

To encourage more recruitment on the Cub Scout Level, additional investments should be made by the council of recruitment activity materials that can be used by units for their recruitment activities. The materials that should be invested in will be based upon the results of the survey of those packs with high recruitment. Communication about the resources available to units for recruitment (free flyers, facebook event boost, yard signs, activity equipment, etc.) will be increased so that their utilization rate increases.

The analysis of the current market conditions will also be used to focus the council membership teams to those areas where the biggest impact is likely to be. The table below outlines those focus areas for both Cub Scouts and Scouts BSA for each district.

In the past few years, we have held the extreme scouting event as an incentive for new scouts as well as those scouts who have recruited new scouts. By all accounts this is a popular

event and is a great incentive for recruitment. However, in past years there has been no widely publicized protocol to identify those scouts who have recruited new scouts to make them eligible for this incentive. This process will be part of the recruitment guide to make clear to all units of this program. In addition, a new protocol will be established for all processed membership applications. Once an application is processed the council membership professional will send an email to the address on the application, this will not only welcome the new family into scouting but will also ask the family if they were recruited by another scout so that they can be added to the list to attend the extreme scouting event.

The final strategy that will be employed to meet our growth numbers will be to offer incentives to units that recruit at least 25% of its 2022 end of year membership total. The incentive that will be offered will be similar in scope to those offered to Scouts BSA units that start a new recruitment program and will be determined by the council leadership.

The council has been at many regional festivals the last few years with high foot traffic, but this has not resulted in a lot of applications. This may be in part because while these festivals attract comers from several towns, material at these events are only focused on the town. By creating a site on the council webpage that would give information on all known recruitment events within the council, a form can be handed out at these events that would be suitable for everyone within the council. Additionally, this could be used to help with marketing campaigns on Facebook to advertise recruitment in general in addition to just specific event boosts.

# Grow Lion Membership by 5%

Lions were the only area in 2022 where the council did not see growth. Since this is the area that will have the longest-term impact on growing our membership special focus will be paid to this area.

While our strategy for growing cub scouts in general will also help us grow our Lion membership, additional strategies will be employed. This additional strategy will be to identify the pre-schools within the council. Then in conjunction with the cub scout packs, in the spring distribute flyers to all the Pre-K 4 classrooms promoting Cub Scouts. This will begin to get families informed of Cub Scouts before other organization do which will give us a first mover advantage.

# Grow Cub Scout Adult Volunteers by 3%

The data shows that a pack with more registered adult leaders tend to have higher growth rate, therefore focus will be added to this area. As part of the pack recruitment guide, a section will be included on adult recruitment. This will include details on presentations to recruit adults, including the timeline presentation seen here https://drive.google.com/file/d/0B7WGV151\_3kfMW1sM2RITmpsa1U/view?usp=share\_link &resourcekey=0-dTxHxuNQq7vo00rCUcPNsg

Focus will be made on packs with an adult to youth ratio of less than 0.3. These will be the focus units where the council membership committee will aid to units. The units will require extra attention are listed in the table below.

# Maintain a retention rate of 85%

In 2022, our council maintained the highest retention rate in the nation and in 2023 in it our intention to maintain that position. The main factor in maintaining this high retention rate is a great unit and council/district program to keep our scouts interested in scouting. Our focus on adding adult volunteers will help with the unit program component of this.

Our council and districts offer a phenomenal program for our scouts with a variety of events to keep our scouts interested in our program. However, right now the unit leader is often the gate keeper to information about our council and district events. In order to keep our retention, rate up when a new membership application is processed the email on the application will be added to the council's mailing list so that the family will receive trail notes and other council information.

# Transition 60% of Arrow of Light Scouts to a Scouts BSA unit

Webelos to Scout Transition has generally been a process that was done only between pack and the troop with little to no intervention by the council. This year our team will be more involved in the process. For this first year, in January the council membership professional will send an email to all Arrow of Light families with contact information to all the local troops in their area and offer the council to assist them with any questions they may have on

the transition process. This is important since right now it is completely on the unit leader to ensure that this process occurs and since most of these families have not gone through this process before they will not know what they need to do.

Starting in May, a list of all Arrow of Light Scouts who have not moved to a troop will be contacted by a council volunteer or professional to determine why they have not moved to a Troop. For those who it is believed are on the fence support will be offered to them to complete the transition. For those who are not interested in transitioning, the reason they are not transitioning will be recorded on a central file, so that this data can be reviewed in the second half of 2023 so that strategies to increase the webelos to scout transition rate in 2024 can be determined.

This strategy will only help so much, if we want to make a meaningful impact on our transition rate we will need to start sooner. Starting in the summer of 2023, all scouts who have earned the bear rank will be contacted giving the families information about the transition process and to give them information on how to contact local units.

Additionally, a guide will be created on the transition process that will be distributed to families who are close to the transition period. This will give them information about the transition process and give them information about the Scouts BSA program and how it differs from the Cub Scout program.

# Start 2 new Scouts BSA girl Troops

The accomplishment of this goals will be led by the volunteer in the newly created council girl recruitment chair. To accomplish this goal, the membership numbers will be reviewed to determine the towns with the largest population of girls in the Cub Scout program that does not have a Scouts BSA girls' unit. These will be the towns that will be targeted for the formation of a new Scouts BSA girl unit. The Council Girl Recruitment Chair will then talk with the families of these scouts to facilitate the formation of these new units. The towns with the largest girl Cub Scout populations that have no girl Scouts BSA unit are shown in the table below.

### Start 3 new Explorer Posts

The council has relationships with several organizations already that would be great partners for Exploring Posts. Our partnership with Avelo airline would make for a great partnership within the aviation industry. The council's relationship with the building trades union for the trades merit badge day could also be leveraged to create one or possibly several new Posts. Additionally, the council should survey the local magnet schools to see if any of these magnet schools would be ripe for a corresponding after school program in a related area that could be fulfilled with an Exploring Post. The mainstay of fire department, police and ambulance Post should still be considered for growth as well. The Council Older Youth Program Professional will lead this effort.

# Start 3 new Sea Scout Ships

With the council's recent donations and investments in the Sea Scouting area extra focus will need to be given to this area. This goal will lead by the newly created Council Sea Scout Recruitment Chair with the assistance of the Council Older Youth Program Professional. Identifying potential charter partners will be a key element to meeting this goal. Boating and sailing clubs along the coast should be prime targets as chartered partners as this would be directly applicable to their purpose and will help to foster future membership growth for their organization as well.

Once new chartered partners are identified the Council Sea Scout Recruitment Chair with the assistance of the Council Older Youth Program Professional will develop a Sea Scout Specific recruitment plan. This plan should leverage our current Scouting base, our new Sail Away School as well as methods to bring in new Scouts.

# Create a recruitment guide for Cub Scout Packs and Scouts BSA Troops and a Webelos to Scout Transition Guide

Many of our units know how to put on a great recruitment program, but there are some that do not know how be successful at recruitment. In addition, leader turn over happens on a frequent basis, making for frequent re-learning by units. Our council will further support our units by developing recruitment guides. These guides will give best practices for recruitment based on the survey results from the highest recruitment units in 2022, discuss all the programs the council has to support unit recruitment activities (printing flyer, providing yard signs, boosting Facebook events and offering some activity materials), strategies for recruiting adults, targeting recruitment of girls, recruitment incentives and retention strategies.

Two versions of this document will be created, one for Cub Scout Packs and one for Scouts BSA Troops. These guides will be launched as part of the membership kickoff event. Following the event, these guides will be promoted on the council's trail notes, the top banner of the council website and social media pages. Additionally, these guides will be emailed to all pack and troop volunteers to ensure that these guides gain as much reach as possible.

As part of this, based upon the survey results the council should consider an additional investment in activity materials to aid units in recruitment of new scouts.

Additionally, a guide will be created on the transition process that will be distributed to families who are close to the transition period. This will give them information about the transition process and give them information about the Scouts BSA program and how it differs from the Cub Scout program.

### Create a set of tools to track membership data more effectively

A set of reports will be created to supplement the new Council Membership Tools offered by the National Council. These tools will be used to track growth, market share, recruitment, retention, webelos to scout transition, Adult Volunteer recruitment, and gender composition at the unit, town, district, and council level. These tools will be made to provide glanceable data that will be used to focus the membership team. These reports will be made available on a monthly basis and will be reviewed with both the volunteer and professional membership teams.

# Create a plan to recruit within the Latino Population

The Latino population has historically been a hard population for our council to recruit from. With our new partnership with LEAD it is now time to develop a full strategy to recruit from the Latino community. The newly created position of the Council Latino Outreach Chair will lead the development of a Latino recruitment plan and develop Spanish versions of our recruitment materials.

# A Data Driven Approach

Data will be an important aspect of our membership plan. On a monthly basis several reports will be made for our team to review that will track all the important aspects of membership including membership growth, retention, recruitment, webelos to scout transition and adult recruitment. These reports will give break downs at the unit, town, district and council level to allow the team the appropriate insight. A review of this data will be made on a monthly basis and assignments will be given to team members, both volunteers and professionals, based on the insights from the data review and the time of year.

An example of this report is shown below for membership growth and market share. The first image shows the data at the unit level. Membership is tracked for every month and the data is color coded to make it easy for the user to determine which units are showing growth and which ones are not.

The next section of the report is a break down at the town, district and council level. Again, the growth numbers are color coded in green and red so the user can easily identify which areas need more focus. The growth % area uses a color code scheme that follows the old JTE scale with negative growth being red, growth of less than 1% being bronze, 1%-3% being silver and >3% being gold. Finally, the market share numbers are a color bar system with the lowest market share being red and the highest being green with a transition between these colors between. This will give the team easy insight into which towns the council is lagging and will require additional focus.







the user to filter down to only data they are concerned with. Depending on the report these filters can include: district, program, and town. Visuals of these 6 reports are shown below.



# **Current Market Analysis**

To understand how to grow our membership in 2023 the state of our council at the end of 2022 must first be understood. This section will look at the membership in several different ways. Data will be examined on the Council, District, Town and Unit level and across all of our program areas. This assessment will allow the membership team to put its focus on the areas that are falling behind of others. It will also allow us to identify the areas that are ahead and will allow us to learn best practices from.

# **Council Level Results**

# Membership Growth

On Council again showed great results for membership in 2022. Growth was shown in all our program areas with the exception of Sea Scouting. Growth varied by program area and is summarized in the table below.

### Recruitment

Recruitment numbers go hand and hand with growth, but the two are not the same. Recruitment represents the number of new scouts we have brought into our program and

excludes any transitioning from program to program. When looking at the recruitment numbers compared to the growth numbers these show two very different situations. While we were able to grow our membership, it was not because of better recruitment. In every category except Exploring, the Council recruited less scouts in 2022 than in 2021 with an overall decline of approximately 10%.

# Adult Volunteers

Growth of our adult volunteers in 2022 was a highlight for our council. Growth was shown across all programs except for venturing. The Cub Scout program showed the highest growth at nearly 50%. This is excellent for two reasons. First, this is the program that requires the most volunteer leadership since the program is not youth led. The other reason is that they serve our youngest Scouts, so they will likely be involved in the program longer than volunteers from any of the other programs. Details of adult requirement are shown in the table below.

With adult volunteer numbers known, the affect they have on growing a unit can be explored. The plots below show the relationship between the ratio of adult volunteers to scouts and growth of youth within a unit. This shows that there is a correlation between the adult to youth ratio and a unit's growth rate at the Cub Scout Level, the higher the ratio generally results in a higher youth growth rate. On the Scouts BSA level there does not appear to be a correlation like there is at the Cub Scout level. This correlation on the Cub Scout level leads to the goal of Cub Scout Adult Volunteer growth. The goal is to eventually get every pack to have a ratio of 0.33 or greater.





Figure 1: Cub Scout Adult-Youth Ratio vs Membership Growth Trend






Figure 2: Scouts BSA Adult-Youth Ratio vs Membership Growth Trend

### **District Level Results**

### Membership Growth

Membership grew in all our districts, but like 2021 growth was led by the Togo West District. Togo West was also the only district have greater than the 3% growth target the council had in place with Pomperaug being the closest to hitting this milestone. All the traditional district's though showed significant membership growth compared to 2021.

When looking at the program level growth, most of the growth for all district was concentrated in the Cub Scout program, and all districts except for Powahay and Togo West actually showed a decline in Scouts BSA membership. Our Venturing program continued its decline with only Togo West now have any significant Venturing population and if this trend continues the Venturing program will no longer exist within our council within the next few years.

While the council made strides to grow the Sea Scouting program with investments in this program, these investments have not yet paid off. There was a decline or no growth in Sea Scout membership in all districts with this program.

The exploring program though has made great strides with significant growth in the Pomperaug district. However, in all other district membership was relatively stagnant or non-existent.

Looking at the Cub Scout program in more detail, the Tiger rank showed the highest growth with high growth across all districts except Powahay. The Cub Scout Sub-program also showing good growth in all districts except for Pomperaug. Webelos showed similar results to the Tigers, but at a much smaller scale. The weak spot was in the Lion program where all districts except for Powahay showing double digit declines.

### Recruitment

While overall membership was up, recruitment numbers were lower than in 2021. Our two largest program both showed large declines in recruitment compared to 2021 with Cub Scouts overall being slightly worse than the Scouts BSA program.

Pomperaug showed the worst results in this area with over a 20% decline in both programs. The other district all showed declines as well, but far less so. The one area of growth in the area was Scatacook with a recruitment growth rate for Cub Scouts of approximately 10% and also in Powahay and Quinnipiac in the Scouts BSA program with very high growth rates. Recruitment in the other Scouting program continues to be very low numbers.

#### Membership Growth

#### Market Share

The tables below show market share numbers for the town sorted from highest to lowest market share. Approximately a third of towns had a market share greater then 5%, and two thirds hitting the benchmark value of 3%. The Cub Scout program showed similar results to the overall numbers, but the Scouts BSA program had a much larger fraction of towns hitting both the 5% and 3% marks.
