

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

Camp opens at 12:30-1:00 pm on Sunday, July 16, July 23 and July 30. A staff member will greet you at the parking lot and direct you to Alderman Administration Center for check in.

As part of check in, you will visit five areas:

- 1. In-process at Alderman Center check in, payment of fees, photos, etc.
- 2. Scouts with medications must turn in their medications at the Health Lodge.
- 3. Your campsite
- 4. Waterfront orientations & swim test.
- 5. Dining Hall- orientation.

(NOTE: parents must stay for the first two steps of check in).

Parents are invited and encouraged to attend the closing brunch on Saturday morning at 9:30 am. The cost is \$10 for adults and \$6 for children 6-12 years old (no charge for 5 and younger).

What you might need money for:

- Snacks and souvenirs at our Trading Post
- Merit Badge books (though you may bring them with you)
- Patrol photograph \$15

Carefully read the requirements of the merit badges you will be taking. If the requirement calls for a report, you will have to write that report. You may do it at home and bring it with you, or you may do it at camp. The more requirements you complete at home the greater the number of badges you can earn at camp.



EXPECTATIONS

What should you expect from your Eagle week program?

- To earn up to four (4) merit badges.
- To work just as hard for each merit badge as you would if they were offered elsewhere.
- To plan and participate in a service project designed by you and all your fellow Eagle week participants.
- To make new friends from all around the Council area.
- To share your thoughts and ideas with others who aspire to be Eagle Scouts.
- To get helpful hints on how to plan and execute your Eagle Scout service project.
- To have FUN!

PACKING LIST

- Completed camp health form (signed by doctor and parent)
- Complete uniform (required at dinner and retreat each evening)

- Old clothes for service project work
- Swimming trunks

- Extra shoes (no sandals, please)
- Sleeping bag or blankets, pillow

- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Mosquito repellant

- Pen, pencil and paper
- Merit badge booklets and anything additional you need to complete your selected merit badges.

- 5. Attend a public meeting, write a report of that meeting and bring it and a Scoutmaster's sign off that the candidate attended that meeting to camp. There will be no off-site opportunities to attend a public meeting.
- 6. Bring materials to be used as teaching aids.
- 8. Work with your unit to plan a court of honor or campfire.
