PARKING PASS: You will find a Parking Pass in this packet, please make sure all vehicles' entering Hoyt has one visible in the windshield. Please ask your drivers to unload as quickly as possible and if they are not staying, to leave ASAP.

Camping/Campsites/Check-in

- The camp will open at 5 pm on Friday. Troops can camp 2 nights, 1 night, or just come for the day.
- **Campsite requests are made through the online registration and will be assigned by staff.**
- Campsites are assigned Jamboree style and are keyed in the map on page 6. **We do not assign campsites by traditional Hoyt campsite names.** Please use the map keys.
- Please check-in BEFORE setting up your campsite. Campsites are pre-assigned.

- **NOTE – NO DUMPSTERS – TROOPS MUST CARRY OUT ALL TRASH!**

Arrow of Light Webelos

AOL Webelos can arrive by 8:30 AM in time for the 9 AM opening ceremony and if hosted by a Troop, can fully participate in the Camporee program.

- Hosting arrangements are made through the Pack and the Troop, and not by district.

Patrol Competition & Structure

- Each patrol should have at least 5 or more scouts with 8 as the ideal number.
- Troops that cannot provide 5 or more for a patrol may be asked to combine with another smaller patrol.
- The patrols will be formed by the SPL of their Troop. The Patrols should be balanced based by rank and age. A troop can enter multiple patrols. Each should have a preassigned Patrol Leader
- Please remember you will need a few older Scouts to help with areas you have volunteered to coordinate.
- There are six stations. Each station will be set up to handle 3 to 4 patrols at a time

Rosters: Gone are the days that we can accept check-in rosters with names scribbled on a piece of paper. Each Troop should possess a roster and it should be readable and contain the following:

- Name of Scout or Adult
- Emergency contact – Cell phone and email.
- Parent Contact for Youth – Phone, email and address
- Medical/Health Alerts - campers with limitations, special needs, recent illnesses, allergies, medications that could affect their participation and other health issues.
- Please remind Scout parents and Adults that Council provides Umbrella Medical Insurance for medical treatment due to accidents at a camporee.

Cooking Contest: We will have a "Grilled Cheese God/Goddess" Cooking competition on Saturday.

Units can use their own ingredients and ingredients. A Host of Olympian Judges will taste test the entrees on Saturday at 12:45pm at Jackson Pavilion.



Cell phones: We have used successful texting messages in past camporee for camporee communications. Please allow cell phones for SPL's and patrol leaders for this purpose.

ALERT – No closing ceremony on Sunday. The program ends at the campfire. PLEASE (we've had problems with this) make sure all campfires are properly distinguished.

The Great Grilled Cheese Cook-off

Can your Troop come up with the best tasting, most unique and utterly irresistible grilled cheese sandwich out there? Then you need to enter the CONNJAM25 DISTRICT CAMPOREE sponsored Great Grilled Cheese Cook-off.



If your Troop has what it takes to grill up the best all-time combo of bread and cheese then you need to start planning your winning recipe. You can add up to 4 other items to your sandwich — meats, vegetables, sauces, etc. You can use different types of bread, cheese or combination of different cheeses and don't forget what you fry your sandwich in can add unique flavoring to it as well.

Each Troop can assign a team of 6 Scouts to represents their troop in the contest. At the discretion of the District, larger troops can enter more than one team and patrols entries will be considered. Please note — entries and awards are based on **no more than 6 Scouts per team**.

You only have a limited lunch period so recipes need to be quick and easy to prepare.

Attention Adult Leaders Cook-off. We're also opening the contest to adult leaders as well. They will have their own contest judged separately from the youth. Same rules and guidelines. One adult entry per Troop.

Judging: A combination of District and unit staff.

GUIDELINES:

1. Judging Criteria is to emphasize how easy the recipe should be and how great it tastes. Texture, appearance and presentation all count as well.
2. Cooking Teams are to bring their sandwich wrapped in foil (to keep warm) to District HQ (Ranger Cabin) before the end of lunch period. All dishes need to be labeled with entry form below. Entries will not be accepted without a list of ingredients.
3. Cooking will take place at the campsite. Proper sanitation and food preparation must be followed. Each Troop should appoint an adult to observe the cooking.
4. Awards: 1st, 2nd, 3rd Awards presented

WRECKING BALL STATION



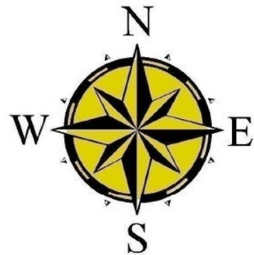
4 Players climb atop their inflated pads. One of the players grabs the "Wrecking Ball" and hurls it at their opponent in an attempt to knock the player off of their inflated pad. 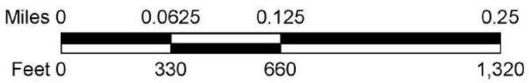
