Welcome Top Shots!

Come one and all to Camp Sequassen to show your top shot ability in various target sports to secure your place at the top of the leaderboard and be named the Top Shot Champion. In this Scouts BSA Top Shot Fall Camporee, sponsored by the Quinnipiac District, scouts will complete in target/shooting sports-based activities and fun competitions to conquer the challenges and become the Ultimate Top Shot Champion! This event is open to all registered Scouts BSA units, Crews, Ships, & Posts.

The Check-In Process & Arrival

Units may check-in between **6:00 – 8:00 pm on Friday, October 20th**. When you arrive at camp, please park in the main parking lot and send the SPL and one Adult to Pisani Pavilion to check-in. At check in you will receive your welcome packet. Units arriving Saturday morning check in will be 7:30 am – 8:30 am at Pisani Pavilion. Please let the Camporee Coordinator know in advance if you plan on arriving on Saturday morning.

Registration, Campsite Selection, & Fees

All units need to register in advance on the council website. The registration link is posted to the district webpage. Units are permitted to camp on Friday and/or Saturday night. Once you register please contact the camporee committee to reserve a campsite. First come first serve. The fees for the camporee are below. The fee includes campsite rental cost, program supplies (including ammunition), and a camporee patch. The unit must provide food for all meals.

Activity Stations

There will be six activity sessions located around Camp Sequassen, with one or two groups assigned to each session at the same time. You will always proceed to the next higher number session until you reach number 6, and then you will go back to station 1. You will always proceed in numerical order. You will have approximately 45 minutes to complete your activity, and 15 minutes to travel to your next session. You will receive a map of the activity stations when you check in. Once all six stations are complete, all groups will assemble on Clark Field for the Campwide Catapult Challenge. A schedule will be given to each group upon check in.

The six sessions are as follows:

- 1) Archery Shooting
- 2) Rifle Shooting
- 3) Shotgun Shooting
- 4) Paintball Shooting
- 5) Slingshot Shooting
- 6) Knife & Ax Throwing

Campwide Catapult Challenge

In the culminating event of the day your unit will be challenged to build a top-notch catapult to launch a projectile to hit the targets bullseye. You will be supplied with spars, the projectile, and rope. You supply the creativity and peoplepower.

Scoutmaster "In a Pumpkin" Cookoff

In this culinary gauntlet challenge the Scoutmasters will be tested to cook a meal fit for a pumpkin. You may cook an appetizer, entrée, or dessert for this challenge. Your dish will be judged on taste, presentation, and budget friendly.

The Check-Out Process

The program ends at 5:30 pm on Saturday, October 21st. Any unit staying overnight are asked to clean up and pack up their camping area by 9:30 am on Sunday, October 22nd.

Competition & Recognition

During the camporee sessions each Scout will complete various activities to earn the Top Shot Challenge Award.



Additional Rules & Regulations

- All Scouts and Scouters are expected to...

 - Follow the principles of Leave No Trace.
 - Be respectful of the property.
 - All vehicles must remain in the parking lot during the event. Vehicles may be used to drop off/pick up gear to the campsite.
