Recruiting Event Best Practices

Make It Fun!

- 1. Plan a hands-on, compelling activity for recruits such as Rockets, Pinewood Derby, Field Games, Ax Throwing, Hiking, Fishing, Slip-n-Slide, Bonfire, or a Combination of these
- 2. Get Scouts BSA Youth to run the activity for the younger recruits
- 3. A treat is always a good idea

Get the Word Out

- 1. Ask your scouts to bring a friend and offer them a prize for doing so (they also get the Recruiter patch)
- 2. Ask parents tell their peers about Scouting and the event
- 3. Share your recruitment event flier via school email distribution to all youth in your target age range
- 4. Visit area schools to pass out your recruitment event flier or coordinate to have kids take them home
- 5. Create a FB event and share it to town/parent/school groups
- 6. Ask parents and leaders to "Like" FB event and mark themselves as "Going"
- 7. Contact Council to geofence FB event to boost it
- 8. Ask local media to include your recruitment event in their Calendar or Community section
- 9. Put up yard signs at local schools and at unit family homes
- Hold uniform day at local schools on day of event*requires coordination with school district and schools
- 11. Put up fliers on bulletin boards around town

Make the Pitch

- 1. Greet new families and scouts with a warm welcome
- 2. Direct new family arrivals to a sign in (a Google form with QR code is preferred to avoid not being able to understand handwriting)
- 3. Youth talk take 5 min to tell the youth about fun Scouting Activities
- 4. Parent talk take 20-30 min to cover Aims of Scouting (preparing youth for life), program schedule, financial commitment, and safety
