



Courses Offered




- * Each scout registered and paid in full by 4/1/2024 will receive the early bird discount.
- ** These specialty program fees must be paid in addition to the applicable base fee. Cooking MB and Trail to Eagle are separate activities - Scouts participating in both would pay a total of \$100 in addition to the base fee.
- ***Price is per adult after 2 free adults per unit. Gold Status units (80% of youth in troop attend Scouts BSA resident camp) receive a third adult is free.

Important Deadlines/Reminders

- Troop youth rosters are due by March 15.
 - Unit registration numbers will be used to assess eligibility to "hold" a site (minimum of 10 Scouts)
- Early Bird Registration: 4/1/2024
- Deposits can be made online, but the remaining balance must be made via check or electronic transfer
- Registration fees are due no later than 4 weeks prior to the start of your camp week
- Camp Check-In Process
 - Arrival begins at 1:00pm, with Camp Orientation starting at 2:00pm (there is no lunch served on Sunday, only dinner at 6:00pm)
 - An adult leader must check each unit in at the Alderman Center (any adults staying longer than the drop-off period must sign themselves in at the Alderman Center)
- Any adults arriving throughout the week must also sign in at Alderman Center upon arrival
