This scholarship is in honor of Ryan Michael Adams. Ryan earned his Eagle Scout Award in May 2011 at the age of thirteen. He went on to earn four Eagle Palm Awards and the Pope Pius XII and Ad Altare Dei Religious Emblem Awards. He was elected to the Order of the Arrow and was elected the Crew Chaplain for his Philmont trek. Ryan was an active leader in his troop, Ridgefield Troop 76, serving as the Senior Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader (seven terms), Troop Guide (two terms) and Patrol Leader. He was nominated for and attended the Youth Leadership Conference in January 2012 and earned the Year-Round Camper Award in September 2009.

In the spring of 2015, Ryan was named the Connecticut American Legion Eagle Scout of the Year and the Connecticut VFW Scout of the Year. He was a Boys State Delegate in 2014, elected Boys' State Treasurer, received the Stempick Award for outstanding boy in his town, returned to Boys State in 2015 as a Junior Leader, and was the CFO of the Connecticut Boys and Girls State Foundation.

Ryan was a skilled outdoorsman, was proficient at knot tying, backpacking, and camping, and enjoyed sailing, scuba diving, skiing, rock climbing, surfing, golf and squash. Ryan demonstrated high academic standards and had a genuine love of learning. He was interested in studying economics and international relations in college. He was a voracious reader, particularly about World War II and Finance. His high school advisor called him a "Renaissance Man" because of his varied interests, talents and knowledge.

Above all else, Ryan epitomized the Boy Scout motto. Ryan was a kind, thoughtful, considerate and respectful boy. He truly cared about other people and put them above himself. He lived by the Golden Rule in every aspect of his life whether it was teaching a special needs scout how to tie knots, doing numerous hours of community service or performing everyday acts of kindness.

Sadly, Ryan was the innocent passenger in a tragic plane crash that stole his life on September 20, 2015, seven days after his eighteenth birthday. He had started his freshman year at Colgate University four weeks earlier and had graduated from St. Luke's School in New Canaan the preceding June. His parents and sister are heartbroken and miss Ryan very much.
