In celebration of America's 250th Anniversary, the Connecticut Yankee Council Activities Committee is launching the America 250 Scouting Awards beginning January 1, 2026. This council wide program invites Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturers, Sea Scouts, and adult leaders to explore America's history and values through fun, age-appropriate activities focused on learning, service, adventure, and civic engagement.

Scouts may earn individual awards or complete all five to earn the George Washington Super Award. Adults who teach or lead the program are eligible for the Nathan Hale Leadership Award. The program is designed to be simple to run at the unit level with no council approval required.

This is a unit administered award, and patches must be ordered by the unit, not by individual Scout or Parent.

Stations for the Klondike:

1. **Fire building:** Patrols compete to build a fire to keep warm and to attract the Yeti. If a patrol can melt a block of ice in a pot, they will earn extra points! Prepare for the elements and start a fire in the cold and snow.
2. **Frostbite:** Patrols will be required to wear oven mitts, in order to simulate working in the cold with frostbitten hands. Shelter is important during the winter and patrols will put together a tent to shelter from the cold with frostbite.
3. **Chasing the Yeti:** Patrols take part in relay races with a different lap each time, such as a three legged race for one, the river crossing game for the second, and chair carrying. Scouts need to be ready to pursue the Yeti no matter where he is in camp.
4. **Shelter Building:** The Yeti has not learned to trust Scouts so patrols will need to hide from the yeti. Patrols will need to build a shelter with whatever materials you bring or find, and it has to withstand a yeti attack.
5. **Yeti Rescue:** The patrols barely escaped the yeti, and now they have various injuries that have to be "treated" with first aid, such as building a stretcher and carrying your "injured" Scout. A Scout should always be prepared.
6. **Yeti Hunt:** Throughout the day, patrols will get clues and pieces of a random coded sentence, for this last station they'll receive a clue to help them decipher the puzzle and reveal the location of the Yeti in camp, and whichever patrol finds it first will get a special award, separate from the 1st-3rd place.

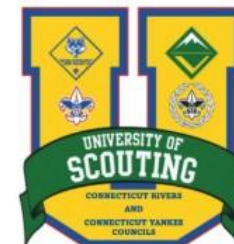

CYC Official Pinewood Derby Guidelines

Car Requirements

- Must be built using the official BSA Pinewood Derby Kit.
- Must be constructed in the current race year by the Cub Scout racing it.

Dimensions & Weight

- Length: Max 7"
- Width: Max 2¾"
- Height: Max 3"
- Clearance: Min 1¾" between wheels and 3/8" underneath
- Wheelbase: Between 4¼" and 4 5/8"
- Weight: Max 5.00 oz (measured on official scale)

Wheels & Axles

- Must use official BSA wheels and axles.
- Wheels may be polished but not reshaped, beveled, or lathed.
- Axles may be polished and lubricated — but:
 - BENDING OF THE AXLE IS NOT ALLOWED.
 - ALL FOUR WHEELS MUST BE IN CONTACT WITH THE TRACK.
 - This ensures fairness and compliance with the official wheel-width guidelines.
 - Only dry lubricant is permitted.

Prohibited Modifications

- No bearings, washers, bushings, or springs
- No starting devices — cars must be freewheeling
- No liquids or loose weights (e.g., lead shot)

Race Procedures

- Cars must pass inspection to race.
- After check-in, only race officials may handle the cars.
- Racemaster will determine reasonable repair time allowed for cars that break during the race.
- No lubrication at the race venue.
- Racemaster's decisions are final.

Conduct

- Unsportsmanlike behavior from any Scout, leader, or spectator may result in disqualification or removal from the event.
